




Severe Weather Outlook: Friday



There is a slight to enhanced risk for severe weather on Friday, 4/19

Severe Risk Area



What to expect

- An approaching strong low pressure system and cold front will push a line of strong to severe thunderstorms eastward across central North Carolina Friday into Friday night. A few of these storms may be capable of producing damaging winds and tornadoes. Very heavy rainfall is likely.
- **Timing:** Friday/Friday night, mainly 1 pm to 1 am.
- **Locations:** All of central North Carolina.
- The strongest storms could produce **damaging straight-line winds and isolated tornadoes. Flooding rainfall is also possible.**
