
THURSDAY'S SEVERE STORM THREAT

STORM PREDICTION CENTER (VALID 8AM 6/20/19 - 8AM 6/21/19)





THUNDERSTORMS (no label)

No severe* thunderstorms expected

Lightning/flooding threats exist with all thunderstorms 1 - MARGINAL (MRGL)

Isolated severe thunderstorms possible

Limited in duration and/or coverage and/or intensity

2 - SLIGHT (SLGT)

Scattered severe storms possible

Short-lived and/or not widespread isolated intense storms possible



- Winds to 40 mph
- Small hail
- Hail up to 1" Low tornado risk

Winds 40-60 mph

One or two tornadoe Reports of strong

- winds/wind damage Hail ~1", isolated 2"

3 - ENHANCED (ENH)

Numerous severe storms possible

More persistent and/or widespread. a few intense

4 - MODERATE (MDT)


Widespread severe storms likely

widespread and intense

5 - HIGH (HIGH)

Widespread severe storms expected

Long-lived, very widespread and particularly intense



- ✓ Large Hail
- ✓ Isolated Tornadoes



- A few tornadoes
- Several reports of wind damage
- Damaging hail, 1 2"










RIVER FLOOD OUTLOOK

Receiving Severe Weather Alerts

- NOAA Weather Radio (NWR):
 - Broadcasts continuous weather information
 - Audible alert when watches/warnings are issued
 - Purchased at electronic and large retail stores for <\$40
- Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA):
 - Alerts via cell phone or mobile device
 - No need to download an app or subscribe to a service
 - Alerts look like text message
 - Free service!
- Cell Phone Apps:
 - Many to choose from that provide real-time NWS alerts
 - Some are free, while others charge a small fee
- Emergency Alert System (EAS) + Radio/TV:
 - Warnings via broadcast, cable, satellite, and wireline services
 - Tune to your local TV, radio station, or web site for details!















Tornado WATCH:

- ✓ Tornadoes are possible
- ✓ Remain alert stay tuned

- ✓ Sighted or indicated by weather radar
- ✓ TAKE SHELTER IMMEDIATELY!



Severe Storms in NC



"Severe" thunderstorms MUST have one of the following –

- √ Hail of at least 1.0" diameter
- √ Winds of 58 mph or stronger
- ✓ Produce a tornado





FLASH FLOOD SAFETY TIPS

- Move to higher ground when
 - A Flash Flood Warning is issued
 - Any possibility of a flash flood exists
 - Do not wait for instructions!
- Do not walk through moving water
- Do not drive into flooded areas
- Do not ignore traffic barricades that close off flooded roadways
- Do not camp or park along streams, rivers, or creeks

of flowing water can carry away most vehicles

of fast-moving water can knock over an adult
