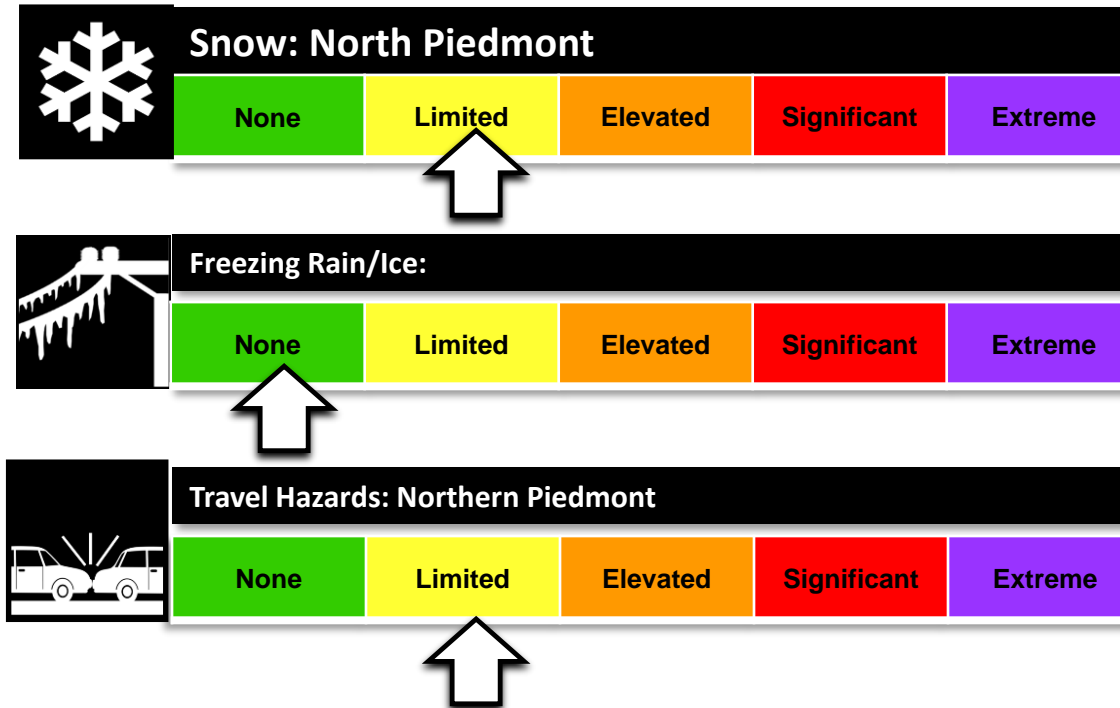
✓ Updated snow amounts



Hazard		Impacts	Location	Timing
Snow		A dusting to up to ½ inch of snow	Highest amounts along and north of the I-85 corridor. Trace amounts of snow are possible as far south as the Hwy 64 corridor.	Sunday through Sunday Evening
Hazardous Travel		Given the light amounts of snow and antecedent warm ground, we are not expecting widespread travel problems. However, we can't rule out the possibility for a few slick spots mainly on bridges and elevated roadways.	North of the Hwy 64 corridor, but especially north of I-85.	Sunday through Sunday Evening
Black Ice		With low temperatures in the 20s Sunday night, patchy black ice will be possible for the Monday morning commute	All of Central NC	Monday morning.

Most of the precipitation that falls Saturday night will be in the form of rain, with snow not beginning until right before sunrise Sunday morning. Snowfall accumulation that does happen on Sunday will be most likely to occur in locations where and when the precipitation rate is briefly higher, allowing cooling to briefly eliminate the rain from a rain/snow mix and allow for all snow.

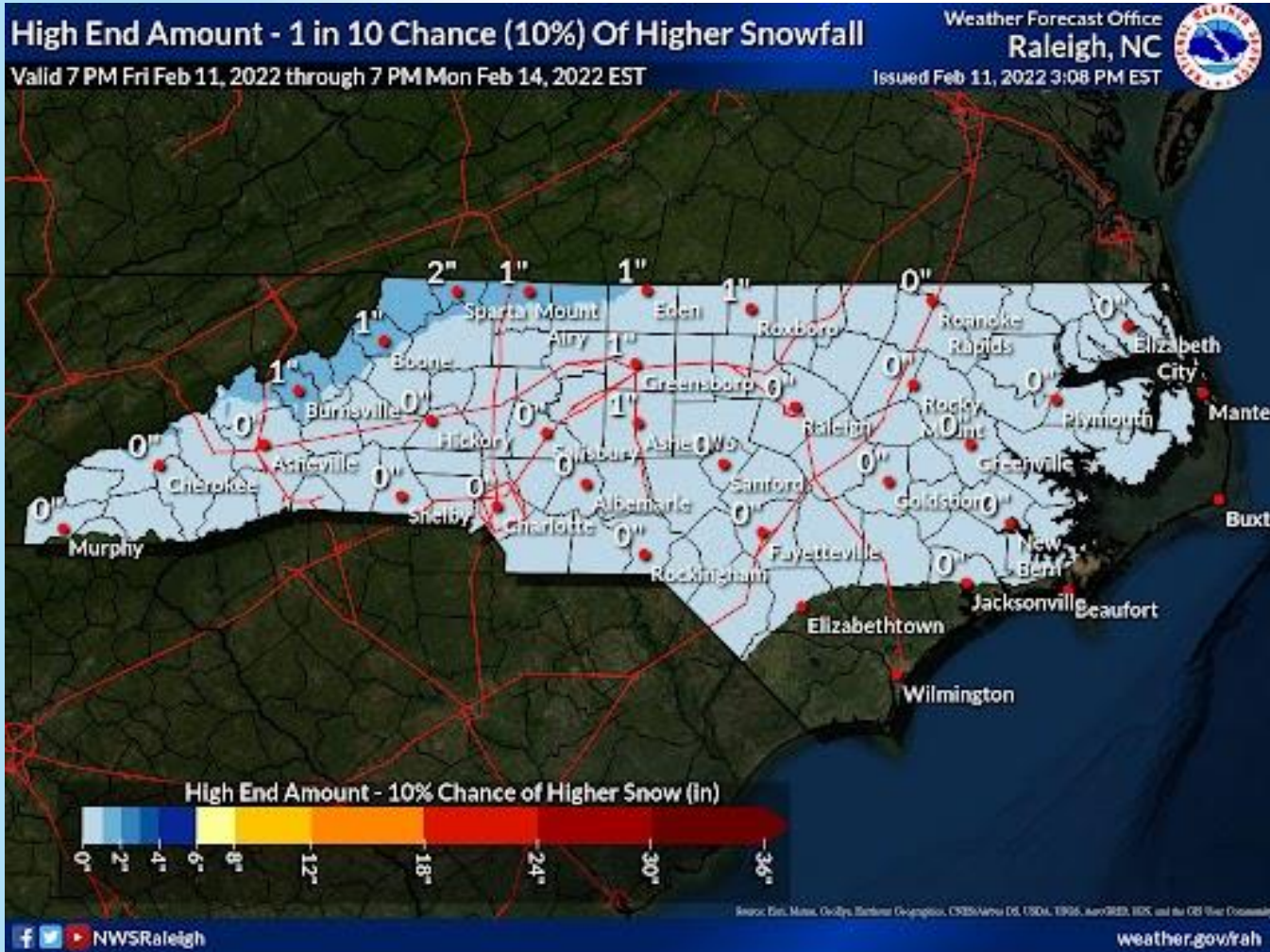


### Key Points:

- **What:** A dusting to up to ½ inch of snow is possible.
- **Where:** Highest amounts along and north of the I-85 corridor. Trace amounts of snow are possible as far south as the Hwy 64 corridor.
- **When:** Sunday through Sunday Evening

### Key Points:

- The worst-case scenario isn't much worse than the "expected" snow amounts shown on the previous slides.
- However, this worst-case scenario shows at least trace amounts of snowfall across all of central NC.

## ***Low-Impact Episode of Light Snow Late This Weekend***

<b>Confidence Level:</b>	<b>Moderate</b>
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Key Points:

- A dusting to up to ½ inch of snow is possible Sunday through Sunday Evening. The highest amounts are expected along and north of the I-85 corridor, with trace amounts of snow possible as far south as the Hwy 64 corridor.
- Most of the precipitation that falls Saturday night will be in the form of rain, with snow not beginning until right before sunrise Sunday morning. Snowfall accumulation that does happen on Sunday will be most likely to occur in locations where and when the precipitation rate is briefly higher, allowing cooling to briefly eliminate the rain from a rain/snow mix and allow for all snow.
- Given the light amounts of snow and antecedent warm ground, we are not expecting widespread travel problems. However, we can't rule out the possibility for a few slick spots Sunday through Sunday Evening mainly on bridges and elevated roadways north of the Hwy 64 corridor, but especially north of I-85
- With low temperatures in the 20s Sunday night, patchy black ice will be possible for the Monday morning commute anywhere across central NC.
