Advisories, Watches, Warnings:

Tropical Storm Warning in effect for Randolph County through Saturday night (10/1/2022). Flood Watch in effect until 0900 on 10/1/2022.

Emergency Operations Center (EOC):

Level 2 – Activated – Staffed with Emergency Services only. Answering non-emergent tree down and power outage calls. No special requests thus far.

Current Situation:

Numerous trees and powerlines down across the county. Trees on houses has also been an issue. One tree landed on a house and made the roof collapse causing the homeowner to be pinned in his recliner. Fire Department and Rescue had to free him.

Preparations:

Pre-storm preparations were completed on Thursday, September 29, 2022. No other preparations being made at this time. Additional 9-1-1 staff have been added for this afternoon and evening.

Weather Forecast for next 12-hours:

Tonight: Showers, mainly before 0500 (10/1/22). The rain could be heavy at times. Low around 55. Windy, with northeast wind 26 to 31 mph, decreasing to 14 to 19 mph after midnight. Winds could gust as high as 49 mph. New precipitation amounts between 1 and 2 inches possible.

Conditions will improve over the next few hours, especially after midnight.

Saturday: A chance of showers, mainly after 2 pm. Mostly cloudy with a high near 65. Southwest wind 5 to 8 mph. New precipitation amounts of less than a tenth of an inch possible.

Commissioner Chairman Darrell Frye issued a local State of Emergency at 1300 on 9/30/2022.

Emergency Services, include Sheriff's Office, providing normal response at the time.

Media has been notified of the local state of emergency & county webpage has been updated.

EOC activated at Level 2 with ES staff only answering non-emergent calls transferred from 9-1-1 regarding trees/power lines down, and other non-life-threatening types of calls.

Media has been continuously updated throughout the event by Dep. Chief Byrd and Media Relations Chelsey Butler.
