- Demonstrate a working knowledge of safety devices (fuses, breakers and fusible links or cartridges).
- Demonstrate the knowledge on how to properly document the vehicle fire.
- Demonstrate the knowledge to photographing the vehicle fire scene in a systematic manner.
- Demonstrate the knowledge of collecting evidence from the vehicle fire scene.
- Demonstrate the knowledge in accordance with National Fire Protection Association 921 Guide for Fire and Explosion Investigation and 1033 Professional Qualifications for Fire Investigators. Note: Current editions will be referenced.
- Demonstrate knowledge of how to obtain recall, technical service bulletin information, consumer complaint information and general research information regarding vehicle fire investigation.
- Attendees will learn the proper techniques for documenting, photographing, evidence collection and preservation including preparing a proper written report.
- A download resource file will be available to the investigators for download including hybrids, the fire tests, and group vehicle examinations. The file is several gigabytes in content.
