



- Some of the stronger storms could produce damaging wind gusts, flash flooding, a few tornadoes and hail.



Timing of Severe Weather on Friday





Enhanced Risk for Severe Storms Friday

- ✓ Confidence is moderate to high for this event.
- Period of greatest impact: Early Friday afternoon through Friday evening.



Damaging winds possible area-wide.



Heavy rainfall of 1 to 1.5 inches will bring a threat of flash flooding, especially in urban and low-lying areas.



Isolated tornado possible area-wide.



Quarter size hail possible area-wide.


