


### **Main Points**

Hazard	Impacts	Timing	Location	
Wind	Scattered to numerous downed trees and powerlines, and isolated structural damage associated with the strongest storms.	Friday morning through Friday evening	All of central North Carolina	
Tornadoes	Tornadoes possible.	Friday morning through Friday evening	All of central North Carolina	
Hail	Hail quarter-size or larger possible.	Friday morning through Friday evening	All of central North Carolina	
Lightning	Deadly cloud-to-ground lighting is expected.	Friday morning through Friday evening	All of central North Carolina	
Flooding	Flash Flooding will be possible where storms train across a given area near the stationary front.	Friday morning through Friday evening	All of central North Carolina



#### What to Expect

- Severe thunderstorms developing along and ahead of a powerful low pressure system will impact central NC on Friday.
- <u>Timing</u>: Mid to late morning through the evening Friday.
- Locations: All of Central North Carolina.
- Some of the stronger storms could produce damaging wind gusts, flash flooding, tornadoes and hail.







Due to recent heavy rains over the past week, river and streams are running high and soils are still wet. Additional heavy rainfall of 1 to 2" (locally higher) on Friday will result in a risk of flash flooding across much of central NC.














## Weather This Weekend for a few Cities

## **Event Summary**

#### **Enhanced Risk for Severe Storms Friday**

- Confidence is moderate to high for this event.
- Period of greatest impact: Friday morning through Friday evening.



Damaging winds possible area-wide.



Heavy rainfall of 1 to 2 inches (locally higher) will bring a threat of flash flooding, especially in urban and low-lying areas.



Isolated tornadoes possible area-wide.



Quarter-size or larger hail possible area-wide.




