Fire Personnel from Randolph County and surrounding areas are invited to participate in Hands on Training Evolutions that are fast paced, and scenario based to build skill for the varied situations that firefighters find themselves in. Who are we looking for: The experienced firefighter who wishes to gain knowledge and expand their current skill set. These courses are not for rookie firefighters. Basic firemanship and rescue skills are assumed by the instructors. What is the cost of Attendance: No Cost- this event has no registration fee for those who wish to participate. Courses to be offered:

Truck Company Operations......Friday Evening – Sunday Afternoon

Instructor: Tim Layton, Battalion Chief of Training – City of High Point

Mid-Mount, Rear Mount Ladders and Engines who serve as Truck Companies

This training is being offered to provide information and best practices for the use of tower ladders and straight ladders on fire/rescue scenes. The advantages and disadvantages of each will be covered as well as the advantages and disadvantages of the mid and rear mount configurations. Additionally, insight will be given into the abilities that engine companies have when operating as a truck company.

Engine Company Operations......Saturday Morning – Sunday Afternoon

This training will provide insight on attack lines, attack line deployment & advancement, and hose loads and their unique purposes. The course participant will gain a knowledge and understanding of the pros and cons of attack line sizes, combination lines, proper placement, and advancement of those attack lines at fire scenes. Additionally, the student will learn how the engine and truck companies work together on the fire scene. Where to spot apparatus and how to supply a truck company will be covered extensively.

PPE Required

Rural Water Operations...... Sunday Only

Instructor: James Fore, Deputy Fire Marshal – Ratings Specialist NC OSFM

This training will provide the participant with the opportunity to learn what big water is and when it is needed. This course will cover the steps needed to evolve away from a single tender operation on small incidents to multiple tenders on large incidents. Participants will operate in the role of a water supply officer with the important task of establishing and maintaining water supplies throughout the life of an incident. Supplying aerials and portable master streams will be covered. De-escalation of the water shuttle will be covered as well.
