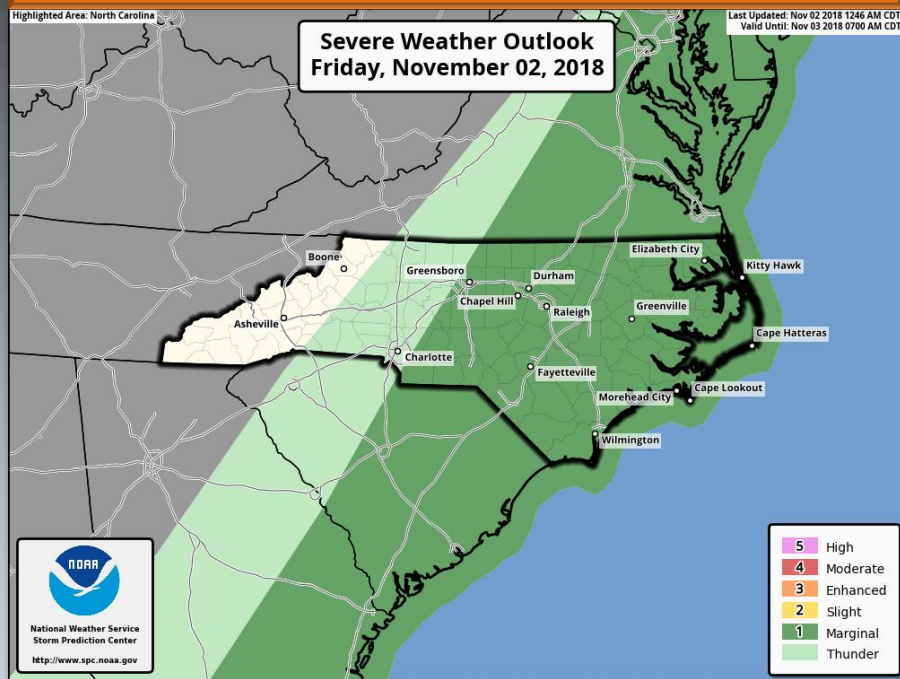




Severe Weather Outlook

There is a Marginal Risk for Severe Weather **This afternoon and evening.**

What to Expect

- Scattered thunderstorms are expected across central and eastern North Carolina this afternoon and evening.
- Timing: *Today 3pm – 11pm*
- Locations: All of Central North Carolina particularly along and east of US highway 1
- Impacts: Some of the stronger storms could produce straight line winds in excess of 50 mph or an isolated tornado. Downed trees and isolated power outages are possible.
